25 February 7pm *Dream Horse* (PG)



Dream Alliance is an unlikely race horse bred by a small-town Welsh bartender. With no experience, she convinces her neighbors to help raise Dream to compete with the racing elites.

In 1961, Kempton Bunton, a 60 year old taxi driver, steals Goya's portrait of the Duke of Wellington from the National Gallery in London.



25 March 7pm *Antoinette in the Cevennes* (M)



A schoolteacher crashes her married lover's family vacation and befriends a donkey named Patrick.

9pm *Rosa's Wedding* (M)

Rosa is about to turn 45 and realises that she's always lived her life to serve everyone else. So she decides to leave it all behind and take charge of her life and fulfil her dream of starting her own business



29 April 7pm *Operation Mincemeat* (PG)



During WWII, two intelligence officers use a corpse and false papers to outwit German troops.

9.30pm *Gold Finger* (PG)

While investigating a gold magnate's smuggling, James Bond uncovers a plot to contaminate the Fort Knox gold reserve.

Four high-school teachers consume alcohol on a daily basis to see how it affects their social and professional lives.

9.30pm *Blind Ambition* (G)

Four Zimbabwean men form their country's first Wine Tasting Olympics team.



26 August 7pm *Love Serenade* (R)



When a slimy, smooth-talking radio jockey from Brisbane, moves in next door, two love-starved sisters compete for his affection.

9.15pm *Nostradamus Kid* (R)

A randy young man is told the world is about to end. In a race against time, his only goal is to bed the love of his life, the local pastor's daughter.



30 September 7pm *Blinded by the Light* (PG)



In England in 1987, a teenager from an Asian family learns to live his life, understand his family and find his own voice through the music of American rock star Bruce Springsteen.

9.30pm *20 Feet from Stardom* (PG)

Backup singers live in a world that lies just beyond the spotlight. Their voices bring harmony to the biggest bands in popular music, but we've had no idea who these singers are.



28 October 7pm *Juniper* (M)



When a self-destructive teenager is suspended from school and asked to look after his feisty alcoholic grandmother as a punishment, the crazy time they spend together turns his life around.

9pm *The Dry* (R)

Aaron Falk returns to his drought-stricken hometown to attend a tragic funeral. But his return opens a decades-old wound – the unsolved death of a teenage girl.
